SUGGESIONS FOR MORE MEMBERS COMING TO MEET-INGS

- Colette B. shared that gift cards for Downtown Frederick could be purchased through the Visitors Center.
- Carlos G. shared that work has been a conflict with our meetings, especially during these COVID times and work expectations.
- Art A. said we might have a Nerd Squad to help persons not familiar with Zoom to sign in. He suggested a few of our younger members to assist. It was shared that their work or school may not work with the timing of our meetings.
- Lt. Gov. Butts another way would be to create a satellite club for the convenience of members who have a conflict with our meeting time. The satellite club could decide the best time for this club to meet. This could also be a part of our growth plan. Lt. Gov. Butts will email us the Satellite Club Tool Kit created by KI for our review of guidelines and recommendations.

She noted that the Middletown Key Club has 111 members and the Gov. Thomas Johnson High School has 20 members. Even with COVID, the Clubs are doing community outreach and service projects.

It was nice to see the energy, creativity and commitment that they have for Key Club and for community outreach. It makes me proud to be a Kiwanian and to be sponsoring these groups. - Lt. Gov. Butts shared that during the months of February and March he is asked to visit each Club's Board meeting to observe the meeting and take notes. Along with his observation there were a few questions that he asked:

Due to our diversity we support many different children's projects. Ray E. noted that our 4H Club support is probably our oldest project.
 - Is there a Youth Protection Program in place? Response: Not at this time. Josh from Endicot does the education on the Youth Protection Program. Lt. Gov. Butts will send Josh's contact information to us. We will set up a meeting with him.
 - Does your club have background checks? [through KI good for 2 years]. SLP advisors should be done every 2 years. Response: A check will be done to make sure we fulfill this requirement. Reimbursement for background checks should be done by the Club.

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In general, how do you feel about how the Frederick Club is accomplishing in their efforts during this time of COVID? Response: We are proud of what our Club has done during COVID.

Lt. Gov. Butts noted there are a lot of positive attributes that this club deserves recognition for and he appreciates having us in Division 7. It was shared that we appreciate Lt. Gov. Butts' attendance at our meetings along with his helpful hints.


Build-A-Bed
