SECRETARY'S REPORT

Lauri C. asked the Board if they had chance to read the minutes as printed in the K-notes. With there being no further corrections, additions or deletions brought forth, President Vona asked for a motion to accept the minutes of June 8, 2021.

Ray E. moved to accept the minutes as presented; seconded by Art A. and carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT [emailed to the Board prior to the meeting]

Administrative Fund Report for June 2021

Bob F. shared with the Board the Administrative Fund Report. (\$58.00) was received for Mike M.'s membership dues. The following expenditures were made: (\$14.99) for internet access, (\$98.00) for our monthly storage rental and (\$32.99) was made for website marketing.

Service Fund Report for June 2021

Bob F. reported that the expenditures this month in the amount of (\$518.25) to purchase items [gift cards & supplies] for Middle School Appreciation and (\$10.08) was made for internet access for credit/debit card collection during Gift Wrapping.

<u>Discussion and Updates</u>: Ray E. updated the Board on 4-H and the fairgrounds. He shared that he is planning to attend a meeting on July 28th and report back to us. He would also find out information regarding the handicapped horse riding split from 4-H.

It was also asked if the 4-H and Handicapped Horse Riding were 501 C3 Charitable organization. The reply was yes.

Discussion:

It was asked if there was a report for our money market account. Bob F. reported that we don't have a money market account at this time. It was transferred over to our checking from Suburban when we combined.

Bob F. reported that PNC called him to recommend that we

put some of our checking account in a money market account for safety reasons. This would not make us anymore money and be accessible monies for any need we may have. Bob assured that our checking account money is safe and that the change would need Board action. There was no action at this time.

Administrative costs were in the amount of \$7,046.31. A credit card fee in the amount of \$46.00 was also made. Colette reported that the Community Foundation is doing well with our money.
