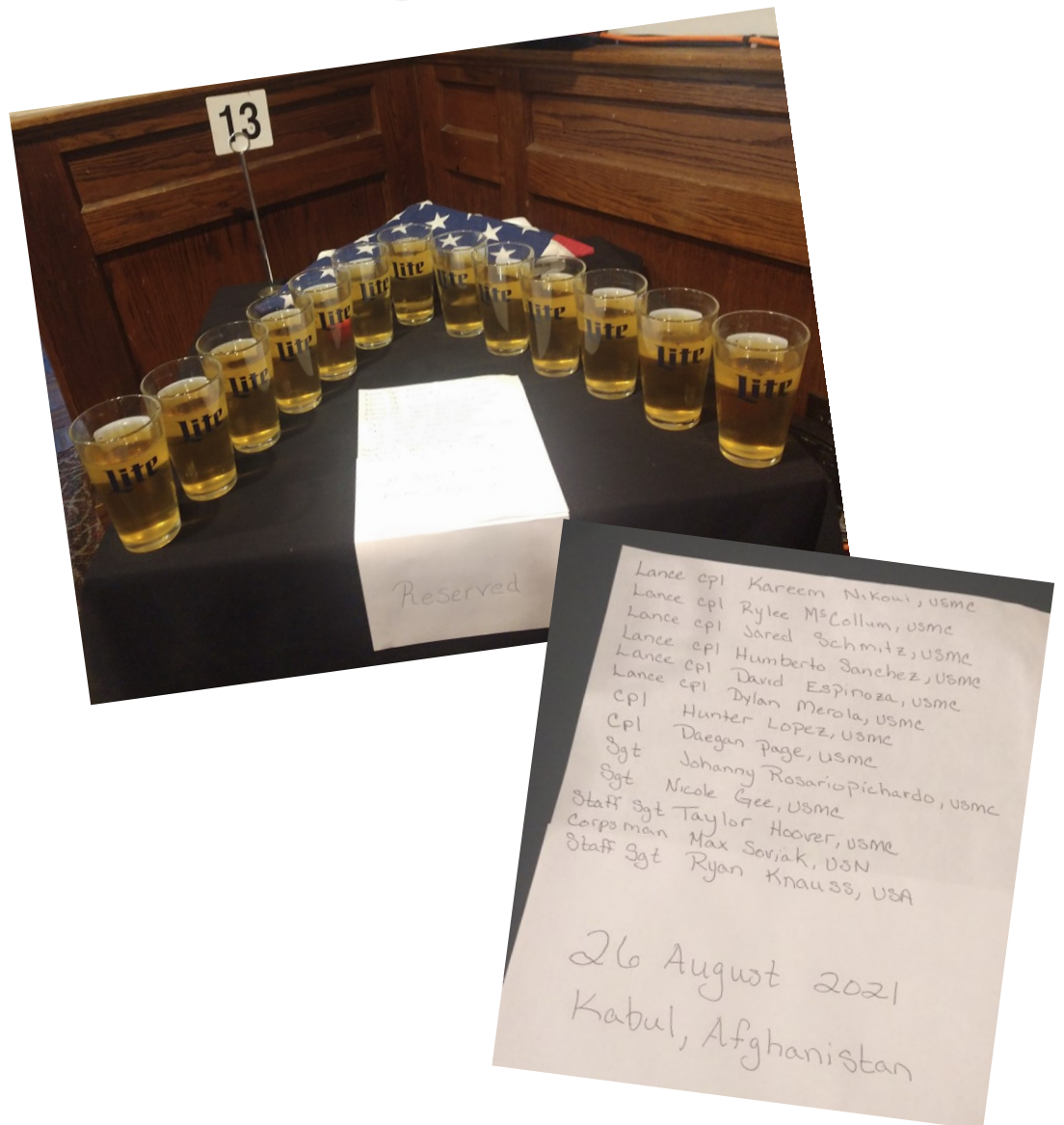
Meetings

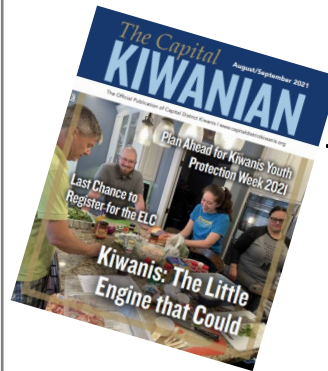
