Kiwanis Club helps SHIP build beds for children in need

Lou Stavelly, president of the Frederick chapter of Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHIP), was the guest speaker at the Kiwanis Club of Frederick's July 26 meeting. He provided the club with an update on local SHIP activities. Nine hundred beds have been made and delivered to children who need them since the local SHIP began a little more than two years ago. SHIP is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that converts charitable donations into well-constructed beds for children who currently have no bed of their own on which to sleep. Approximately 20 beds at a time can be assembled and delivered, complete with mattress and bedding at no cost to the recipients.
