The Great Frederick Fair Notes from Dr. Ray Ediger, of the Kiwanis Club of Frederick

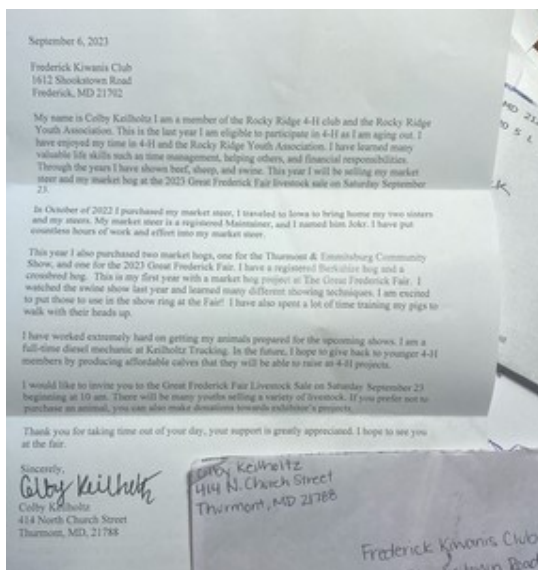
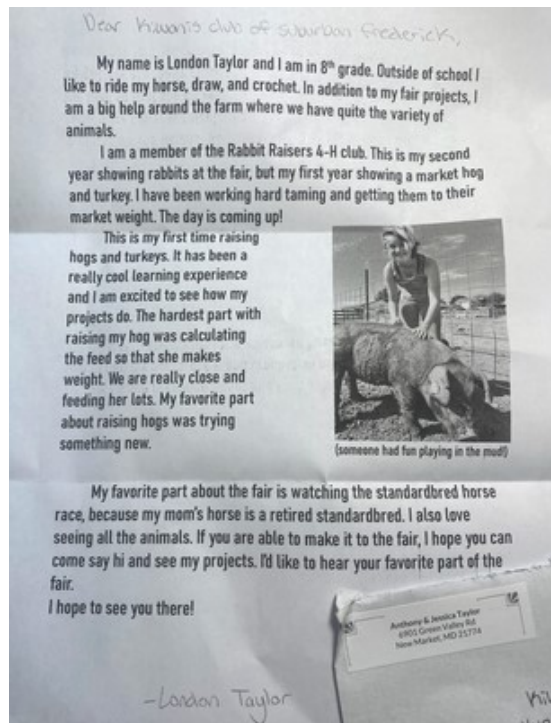
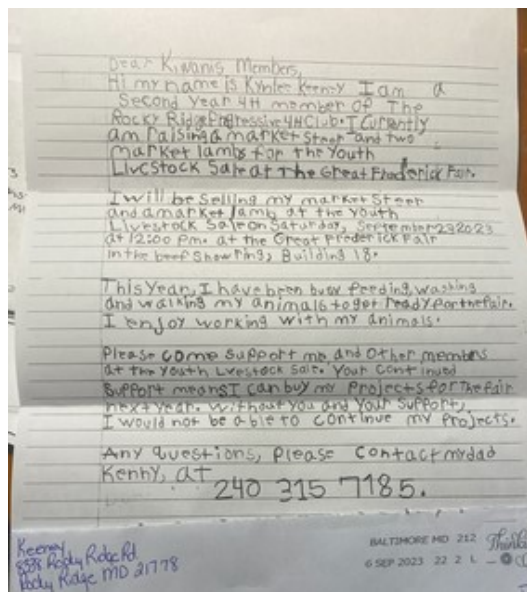
Together Dave Maloney and I received 25 letters from 4-Hers requesting support from the Frederick Kiwanis Club for their animal projects displayed at the Great Frederick Fair. Their ages ranged from 8-17 years and I found each of them deserving of our support. Their names are below along with a sample of their well-written letters requesting support.

I then attended all of the livestock shows and selected 22 additional youth that demonstrated exceptional qualities. These children were kind, respectful and were helping each other. I was especially moved by several really young children that I felt needed encouragement.

There were 333 beef, sheep, swine, goats, turkeys and rabbits in the sale on Saturday, September 23rd, a cold and rainy day. I elected not to buy any animals due to the extremely high prices for example turkeys \$1,000 and rabbits \$550, one steer brought \$60,000. Rather I distributed the \$3,500 allotted on their projects evenly over 44 children by what is called add-ons.

The Kiwanis Club was recognized publicly as a Supporter of Frederick County Youth. I believe it is a project that demonstrates Kiwanis' commitment to our youth. A commitment I hope we will continue in the future.

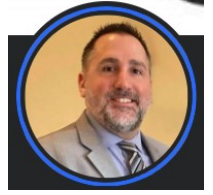
