






Club Member a Conference Speaker





Her vision—along with the generosity of the Frederick community—led to Frederick Health being built on a solid foundation of philanthropy. Not only was Emma the first president of the hospital, she generously donated the land on which Frederick Health resides, and she worked tirelessly with her dedicated group of women to raise the \$8,000 needed to open the original hospital."


