




The Go Team of therapy dogs was the topic of a recent speaker program presented by Doug Heagen who along with his goldendoodle Shasha is very active in the Frederick chapter of this nationwide program. The organization had its beginning as a result of the Colorado Waldo Canyon fire which started June 23, 2012. On June 26th, the fire blew up and raced down the foothills into the Mountain Shadows area of Colorado Springs. It was not declared 100 percent contained until July 10, 2012. Over 32,000 residents were evacuated, two souls were lost, and 347 homes destroyed.

Two therapy dogs and their handlers visited displaced residents in hotels and evacuation centers. They also spent time with first responders. The dogs provided comfort and distraction to those dealing with the tragedy. In fact, the reception was overwhelmingly positive! Current Executive Director Nancy Trepagnier – one of the original volunteers – saw the need for well-trained therapy and crisis handler/dog teams, the GO TEAM was started, and the rest is history! PROPOSED Frederick Kiwanis Travel Procedures

Kiwanis encourages participation in attending conferences & conventions.

Frederick Kiwanis recognizes the benefits of attending Kiwanis sponsored conferences and conventions and has budgeted for such further educational opportunities.

To make aware that we value these functions and help with expenses.

Requests for travel to conferences and conventions must be requested to the Board of Directors for approval. Requests will be made in writing with expenses as detailed as possible. A copy of the conference notice with names requesting attendance can suffice. If formal appointments are necessary they can be made at that time if approved.

To be made aware and to have some control over number attending so as to not bankrupt our budget.

Frederick Kiwanis may approve listed conference registration fees, lodging expenses as outlined in conference announcements and meals that are part of conference registrations.

Necessary conference fees, can preclude "hosting" or meals outside of those conference provided expenses.

Meals not covered by conference registration can be reimbursed by submitting receipts to the Board of Directors for approval.

Allows for meals outside of actual hotel/conference provided meals during event.

While transportation is not an automatic approval, vehicle parking and necessary local transportation can be approved by submission to the Board.

Allows for "field trips" if part of conference and not covered by registration.

Kiwanis members taking guests will incur the expenses of the guest at their own expense.
