Dr. Larry Romaine: Recent Speaker on Vaccines

VACCINES

Dr. Larry Romane, 3/25

I'm a firm believer in "EBM" – <u>Evidence</u> <u>Based</u> <u>M</u>edicine. But, thanks to the Internet, <u>opinions</u> about vaccines often bypass scientific evidence. For this talk, I used 4 specific websites: NIH, CDC, Mayo Clinic, and Cleveland Clinic. Let's start at the beginning:

1. WHAT <u>IS</u> A VACCINE? A vaccine is a molecule your immune system thinks is a germ. Medically, vaccines are Antigens that cause your body to make protective Antibodies against bacteria and viruses.

2. ANTIGENS AND ANTIBODIES – WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE? An <u>Antigen</u> is a chemical molecule your immune system recognizes as "foreign". An <u>Antibody</u> is the "hand in glove" chemical you make to fight that specific antigen.

3.HOW IMPORTANT ARE VACCINES? Remember, "an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure". That makes vaccines the greatest medical advance in history. Period!

4.*ISN'T THAT AN EXAGERATION*? You decide: In the 1950's, Paralytic Polio ran rampant in the U.S. In 1952, there were about <u>57,000</u> cases (including 21,000 paralyzed, and 3,000 dead). Then, Dr. Jonas Salk did massive testing for his Polio Vaccine. It was approved for widespread use on April 12, 1955. By 1961, Polio cases in the U.S. had dropped to <u>161</u>!

5.HOW ABOUT VACCINES FOR OTHER DISEASES? Some "Pre" and "Post" vaccine numbers are:

- Measles: 1950 = 500,000 cases vs. 338 cases in 2020;
- Diphtheria: 1950 = 5,796 cases vs. 6 cases in 20220.
- Tetanus: U.S. cases decreased <u>95%</u> from 1947 (first reportable year) to present;

6.*IF I'M VACCINATED, AM I 100% PROTECTED?* Absolutely <u>not</u>! No vaccine is 100% effective at preventing any disease. Your annual "Flu Shot" is a good example. From 2009 to 2024, the protection rate varied from a high of 60% (2010) to a low of <u>19%</u> (2014).

7.THAT'S TERRIBLE. WHY WASTE THE MONEY? Widespread vaccination improves "herd immunity". That lowers everyone's risk – even the unvaccinated!

8.OK, WHAT'S "HERD IMMUNITY"? There are over 8 billion homo sapiens in our "herd". We catch infectious diseases from other herd members. Say a vaccine is only 60% effective. But, <u>everyone</u> (except me) got vaccinated. <u>My</u> risk just dropped by 60%!

9.BUT, WHAT ABOUT <u>DEATHS</u> FROM THE VACCINES THEMSELVES? <u>All</u> medicines for <u>anything</u> carry the possibility of deadly allergy or unintended side effects. Example: Penicillin prevents the common "Strep Throat" from becoming the deadly "Rheumatic Fever". The price? 500-1000 patients <u>die</u> from penicillin allergy each year.





10. WHAT VACCINATIONS ARE RECOMMENDED FOR SENIORS?

Currently, CDCP (<u>Centers for Disease Control & Prevention</u>) in Atlanta recommends <u>all</u> seniors be fully immunized against:

- INFLUENZA: The "Flu" virus mutates (changes shape) often. That means a <u>new</u> Flu shot every year. "High Dose" is recommended for seniors. What's the big deal? In 2017, Influenza <u>killed</u> twice as many Americans as Breast Cancer!
- TETANUS: The current vaccine is a 3 in 1 winner. It's called "TDAP" because it prevents <u>T</u>etanus, <u>D</u>iphtheria, <u>And P</u>ertussis ("Whooping Cough"). And, it lasts <u>10</u> years!
- "PNEUMONIA SHOT": This prevents infections by "Pneumococcus" bacteria. That <u>one</u> germ is a top cause of Pneumonia, Meningitis, and Blood/ Bone/ & Sinus infections.
- ZOSTER: We all survived childhood "Chickenpox". But, the virus didn't go away. It's been hiding in your spinal nerves for decades. It <u>re</u>-emergences in 1/3rd of seniors causing "Shingles". That's a painful, blistering rash along a spinal nerve. And, it can become <u>permanent</u>. The "Shingrix" vaccine is 90+% effective for prevention.
- COVID: Everyone over age 6 needs a COVID primary series. Adults need a booster at 6 months. "High Risk"* seniors may need additional boosters.
- RSV: "<u>R</u>espiratory <u>Synsitial Virus</u>" usually causes mild cold symptoms in Fall or Winter. <u>But</u>, infants and seniors may have life-threatening complications – especially "High Risk* patients. Over age 75? One RSV injection. Age 60-74 <u>and</u> High Risk = one RSV injection. (RSV vaccines by Pfizer & GSK carry a <u>new</u> FDA warning of a rare complication. The RSV injection by Moderna does not.)

11.AND LAST, HOW ABOUT A MYTH BUSTER? Does the MMR vaccine cause autism? "<u>no</u> vaccine associated cases of autism among 1.8 <u>million</u> children" (journal of "Clinical Infectious Diseases", 2009)
